

What is art? Why is it important? Why should I care?

In this choice-based classroom you will create your own understanding of visual art largely through self-exploration of materials, techniques, concepts and content.

What will we DO?

- *Daily Journals* will be kept to organize your brainstorm process, gather thoughts and information, research concepts, practice with new materials or techniques, and complete fun drawing or writing prompts
- *Mini Lessons* will be completed as a whole group prior to each unit to introduce concepts or techniques
- *Independent Projects* are in depth self-directed artworks which use the concept and/or skill introduced in the mini lesson in a unique way to create an original artwork
- *Reflections* are critical or analytical responses to created artwork and can be oral or written

How will your work be graded?

"It's not our job as art teachers to assess student artwork. That sounds shocking, I know, but if you reflect on it for a moment, you'll see that this statement is quite obviously true. It is our job as art teachers to assess student learning." – O. Gude

- 10% Daily Journal: thoughtful completion of daily writing assignments & drawings
- 30 % Mini Lessons: technical and conceptual mastery of a given media or topic
- 40% Independent Projects: the physical production of an artwork
 - Every project will have an accompanying scaled grading rubric given in advance
 - One project will be due each grading cycle (4 progress reports per semester)
- 20% Reflections: these are usually written, summative evaluations of personal process and product

Unfinished work will graded "*as-is* "on the due date but may be accepted (with valid explanation) up to the next grading cycle deadline for an altered grade. Students may turn in an alternative artwork from a previous cycle to increase their grade for that unit. Extra credit is also available in the form of journal entries.

The general rules:

RESPECT is the most important rule for EVERYONE in the classroom

I promise to respect your opinions, to be honest/open and to treat you with kindness. My goal is to help you become a successful artist/problem solver; I am here to help you!

... In turn I need for you to have respect for:

- **EACH OTHER**: use kind/encouraging words, listen to the speaker, cooperate productively in groups and individual activities and keep your hands/objects to yourself
- **LEARNING:** be in class on time, pay attention, work hard to complete your coursework, ask questions, be open to new ideas, and do your best!
- MATERIALS: clean your space/supplies and leave the room cleaner than you found it.
- **CLASSROOM:** use materials and other supplies only as instructed/demonstrated, navigate the room safely by walking at all times, treat desks floors and

Other Policies:
